Intensive interaction is an approach developed by Dave Hewett in the 1980s. It is a useful approach for those people in the early stages of communication and social skills. During the session we will discuss why and when this approach can be useful and have time to consider how this can be incorporated into the school day.

Using Intensive interaction involves the adult observing and responding to the actions and noises of the person. We will discuss what we are looking for in the interaction and how we can respond. We will spend some time discussing the theory behind the approach and why this can be a useful way of connecting with people.
